Two Long-Term Postdoctoral Positions in Theoretical Particle Physics

The Particle Physics group of the Faculty of Physics at the University of Vienna (<https://particle.univie.ac.at/>) has **two openings for long-term University Assistant (postdoc) positions** in theoretical particle physics phenomenology due to hires of the former University Assistants to permanent or tenure-track academic positions. Each position has a contract period of up to **6 years** that may start as early as on March 1, 2022, but at the latest on October 1, 2022.

Preference will be given to internationally recognized candidates who are sufficiently experienced to pursue their own research program, interact with the present group members and complement their research interests, attract third-party funding, supervise students, promote and conduct national and international networking activities and take an active part in advancing the group development. The research interests of the group focus on particle physics phenomenology, including collider and jet physics, high-precision Standard Model calculations, effective field theories for strong and electroweak interactions in the context of high- and low-energy processes and field theory aspects in physics beyond the Standard Model. The group includes André Hoang, Massimiliano Procura as permanent members, postdocs and a large number of PhD and Master students.
